1. Who We Are

We are the data controller for the purposes of UK data protection law.

2. What Personal Data We Collect

We may collect and process the following types of personal data:

- **Identity information:** name, date of birth, nationality, and passport or ID details.
- **Contact information:** address, phone number, and email address.
- **Case information:** immigration history, employment, education, family, or financial details relevant to your case.
- **Special category data:** information about health, race, religion, or political opinion (only where relevant to your immigration matter and with your explicit consent).
- **Website and enquiry form data:** details you provide when contacting us through our website, such as your name, message, and contact details.

3. How We Use Your Information

We use your personal data to:

- Provide immigration advice and assistance.
- Communicate with you about your enquiry or case.
- Maintain records as required by the IAA.
- Comply with legal and regulatory obligations.
- Improve our services and website functionality.

We will **never** sell or share your information for marketing purposes.

4. Lawful Basis for Processing

We process your data based on one or more of the following lawful grounds:

- **Contractual necessity:** to deliver our services to you.
- **Legal obligation:** to comply with IAA or statutory requirements.
- **Consent:** when you voluntarily provide data through our enquiry form or for special category data.
- **Legitimate interests:** to manage, operate, and improve our business responsibly.

5. How We Store and Protect Your Data

Your information is stored securely on password-protected systems.

We use appropriate technical and organisational measures to protect against unauthorised access, disclosure, loss, or misuse.

Electronic data is encrypted, and any paper files are kept in secure storage.

We retain your personal data only for as long as necessary to fulfil the purpose it was collected for, and to meet legal and regulatory requirements.

6. Sharing Your Information

We may share your personal data with:

- The Home Office, HM Courts & Tribunals Service, or other official bodies where required for your case.
- Translators, interpreters, or expert witnesses assisting with your application or appeal.
- Our professional advisers or auditors (where required for compliance).

We will not share your data with any third parties for marketing or unrelated purposes.

7. Your Rights

Under the UK GDPR, you have the right to:

- Access the personal data we hold about you.
- Request correction of any inaccurate information.
- Request deletion of your data where appropriate.
- Withdraw consent at any time (where processing is based on consent).
- Object to processing or request restriction of processing.
- Lodge a complaint with the **Information Commissioner's Office (ICO)** if you believe your data has been mishandled.
